My son, Douglas G. Placek #3711cba, the great grandson of Ella Ray Hoopes #3711 recently built a home in a new small development in Yardley, Lower Makefield Township, Bucks Co, PA. The name of his street is "Pownal." One day while working on our family history, up popped Pownall, George and Eleanor, on my computer. I called my son and asked him the names of the other streets in his development. They are Merrick, Bartlett and Burgess. At the library, the maps of original land grants included one to George Pownall and one to Joshua Hoops (spelling on map). .. *The Hoopes Family Record* states that Joshua Hoopes married Eleanor Pownall (the young widow of George Pownall) in 1693... I also spoke to the Lower Makefield Township Historian, Ralph Thompson...and he stated that he picked the street names for the developer. He also said that in 1930 some people doing research on the Hoopes line mistook the brick home on the property as that of the home of Joshua Hoopes. Mr. Thompson said that the development is definitely on the original property of George Pownall. Therefore, I say, my son is living on family property 300 years later! Interesting? [Indeed!]

One of our cousins has some very old pictures from the Forsythe family. One of them is of Davis Forsythe [#2078 - 5^{th} generation] taken in 1858. If anyone in this branch of the family would like to have them, please write, call or email the Hoopes Family Organization.

[from several "Looking Back" features in the DLN sent by Donald Hoopes Hannum, Wagontown, PA] 50 years ago today (5-3-98) - ...Due to cooperation of the borough council and fraternal organizations in West Chester coupled with individual troop support, a troop house was going to be built on the Hoopes Park Day Camp property. The building would be complete with a four-foot brick fireplace and four outside fireplaces and picnic tables were to be added... 10 years ago, West Chester school board member Irene G. Shur was "broken-hearted" about the tentative sale of the Convent house to the Chester County Hospital. Shur, a history professor at West Chester University, was a previous owner of the 1827 former Hoopes brothers mansion. Shur tried to buy the house back before she was outbid by the Chester County Hospital. The house was home to 11 low-to moderate-income families. The tenants were given two months notice to leave. The Hoopess were one of the first Quaker families to settle in Chester County and the home, said Shur, was a stop of the underground railroad as evidenced by an underground tunnel system.

50 years ago today (6-6-99), Ellis Hoopes Maris, Jr., student at S. Horace Scott Senior High School, Coatesville, was the winner of the first Scholarship Grant given by Lukens Steel Company...\$1000 a year for four years, toward a college engineering degree. [Interesting that there's also an Ellis Maris "Mace" Hoopes #5531, born 1861.]

50 years ago today (10-4-99), the finest piece of equipment added to West Chester's fire-fighting strength in many years - a \$26,000 aerial ladder truck - was formally housed with appropriate ceremonies at the Fame Company engine house...Presentation of the new truck, which carried a 65-foot ladder, was made by Thomas Hoopes, Jr., president of (the) borough council...

[from articles in DLN & "Planning Tomorrow Today" sent by Donald Hoopes Hannum, Wagontown, PA] Diana C. Hoopes was hired this year as Program Assistant for the Agricultural Land Preservation Board and Agricultural Development Council. With husband Barclay Hoopes [#8966], she has managed the family dairy farm in New Garden Township. They are 3rd cousins and their 4 children are the 6th generation of Hoopeses to live on this farm. Diana has extensive agricultural knowledge from hands-on experience and from her background as an Agricultural Land Preservation Board member and at the County Bureau of Land Records. She had to face personal and professional challenges during the drought this year and was widely quoted regarding the negative functional and economic effects of the hot summer on local farmers and their livestock.

[excerpted from a 7-9-99 *Pennsylvania Inquirer* article sent by Donald Hoopes Hannum, Wagontown, PA] Art Hoopes of Christiana is one of the 800 volunteers of Good Works who are helping 50 families by providing needed home repairs for people who can't afford them and don't have the skills to do the work themselves. Art, as is the case with many of his other coworkers in the program, wasn't a carpenter, builder or contractor before retiring; but they all work under the direction of a paid professional crew chief. Art participated in the trailer repairs that constituted the 100th success story for Good Works.

[from email sent by Polly and Tony Ostheimer, St. Ignatius, MT] Caroline Lippincott Hoopes Parke (see #8113 under Addenda) and Thomas Parke MD built a superb stone home with slate roof in 1941 located on Route US # 30 (#1206 The Lincoln Highway) just east of Downingtown, Chester County, PA. 19335. Since Caroline's passing in June '99, her son Tom remains in the east half of the home, called "P Patch Farm", which has about 40 acres of farmland around it. Tom, Patty (Martha Hoopes Parke Gibian), Polly, and Peggy (Margaret Wistar Parke) and spouses now own this home in a partnership created back in the 1980s.

Polly and Tony have formed the "Parke- Hoopes Charitable Association", and registered this with the PA Secretary of State, and we hope Polly's sibling will join with us in preserving the house and about 4 acres, as a potential future HQ for Parke Society, Hoopes Family Assoc., Clan McIlvain, Clan MacBean, Sellers Family Assoc., Vernon Family Assoc., and any others who might someday want to set up computer centers and research rooms, stash their libraries, hold convocations in Chester County, etc. "P Patch Farmhouse" has been open several times for the "Chester County Day" home tour which benefits Chester County Hospital where Dr. Tom Parke was chief of staff and Caroline was the oldest living volunteer, and we hope to continue doing this. We anticipate that the farm land surrounding P Patch will someday be sold for light industrial development because it is between Rt. #30 and the new Rt. #30 by-pass, highly desirable, and on a highly visible hill. But we hope to save the house. Parke Society needs a permanent library and records storage location, presently these being housed in officer- members' homes. So they have sent a delegation to look over the home, meet with the family, etc. We invite Hoopes Family Association to do the same.

Vol II - p 667 - **8113.** Caroline Lippincott Hoopes Parke died 12 Jun 1999 at her home near Downingtown, PA at the age of 92½ Born in Paoli, she was the daughter of Wilmer Worthington Hoopes and the late Martha Lippincott Hoopes. She was a member of Joint Master Whiteland Hunt, The Chester County Hospital Auxiliary, and Valley Garden Club. She had been the widow of Dr. Thomas Parke for 34 years. Caroline had been "homebound" and handicapped from a major stroke, her chief care-giver being her granddaughter Margaret Wistar Gober, DVM and specialist in sheep, goats, llamas and small ruminants, a 1998 grad of U. of PA School of Veterinary Medicine. Grandson Robert David Gober of Chester Springs, PA was a frequent visitor, married on 26 Sept. 1998 to Nancy Griffin of Christiana, Lancaster County, PA. She is survived by 3 daughters, Martha P. Gibian of Prague, Czech Republic, Margaret P. Gover of Rutledge, and Mary P. Ostheimer of St. Ignatius, MT; one son, Thomas E. Parke of Downington; 10 grandchildren and 13 great-grandchildren. Many Hoopes cousins attended her Friends Meeting for Burial and a former Hoopes Brothers and Thomas Nursery employee spoke about his 80-year acquaintance with the family.

Caroline L. Hoopes Park's father, Wilmer Worthington Hoopes, was another descendant of Daniel Hoopes, the Marshalls, and Hoopes Brothers and Thomas Nurserymen. Through her marriage to Thomas Parke, MD of Downington, PA, Caroline brought together three of the old Park/Parke lineages in America...while her husband was descendant from Thomas Parke and Rebecca Hooper (or perhaps Hoopes?), [who emigrated] to Chester County, PA from Dublin, Ireland on "Sizargh", 1724.

Caroline's children include a son who served as a "medical guinea pig" and timber slash cleanup man with the American Friends Service Committee and Mennonite General Council, a daughter and son-in-law who married in Meeting, but served 12 years commissioned officer time in USMC before resigning to become conscientious objectors, and a grandson who's served as a carpenter missionary and church-builder for HIM.
